JOHNSON CNDEMNS VIET CONG ATTACK ON SAIGON PALACE(380)
WASHINGTON-- PRESIDENT JOHNSON CONDEMNS THE VIET CONG MORTAR ATTACK
ON SAIGON'S PRESIDENT NGUYEN VAN THIEU IN THE SOUTH VIETNAMESE CAPITAL.

"THAT ACTION OUGHT TO REVOLT THE CIVILIZED WORLD," MR. JOHNSON DECLARED AT AN IMPROMPTU PRESS CONFERENCE NOVEMBER 10.

VICE PRESIDENT HUMPHREY AND SOUTH VIETNAMESE LEADERS WERE IN INDEPENDENCE PALACE IN DOWNTOWN SAIGON WHEN MORTAR SHELLS FIRED BY VIET CONG TERRORISTS LANDED ON THE PALACE GROUNDS THE NIGHT OF OCTOBER 31. THERE WERE NO INJURIES TO OFFICIALS ATTENDING THE RECEPTION.

MR. JONNSON REAFFIRMED AMERICA'S DETERMINATION TO CONTINUE
ITS COURSE IN VIETNAM. HE SAID THE UNITED STATES IS WILLING
TO NEGOTIATE NOW FOR PEACE, BUT COMMUNIST NORTH VIETNAM HAS GIVEN
NO RPT NO INDICATION THAT IT WILL HALT ITS AGGRESSION AGAINST THE
SOUTH.

"WE CONTINUE TO STAND WILLING TO NEGOTIATE NOW--TO STOP THE BOMBING," THE PRESIDENT SAID.

"THE PROBLEM IS WITH THE ENEMY, WHO INSISTS ON CONTINUING THE COURSE THAT PLACES US IN VIETNAM AND THAT WILL KEEP US THERE UNTIL THEY DECIDE THAT MIGHT DOES NOT RPT NOT MAKE RIGHT," HE SAID.

MR. JOHNSON REITERATED THAT THE UNITED STATES IS "READY TO GO THE LAST MILE"--TO STOP THE BOMBING AND ENTER INTO PROMPT PEACE TALKS WHENEVER THEERE IDW SDINDICATION THE ENEMY WILL NOT RPT NOT TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE PAUSE. BUT THERE HAS BEEN NO RPT NO ENEMY RESPONSE TO THIS OFTEN-REPEATED PROPOSAL, THE PRESIDENT STRESSED.

MR. JOHNSON SAID HE WAS OPTIMISTIC ABOUT THE COURSE OF THE WAR, AND FELT PROGRESS IS BEING MADE. "I HAVE NOT RPT NOT THE SLIGHTEST DOUBT THAT WE WILL FIND A SOLUTION," HE SAID.

THE PRESIDENT SAID HE IS HOPEFUL THE NEW GOVERNMENT IN THE REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM, HEADED BY PRESIDENT THIEU AND VICE PRESIDENT KY, WILL CONTINUE THE PROGRESS OF THE LAST 13 MONTHS.

IN RESPONSE TO A QUESTION ABOUT PEACE DEMONSTRATIONS IN
THE UNITED STATES, MR. JOHNSON SAID THAT THERE HAVE BEEN
"NO RPT NO GREAT UNEXPECTED DEVELOPMENTS FLOWING FROM VARIOUS
SUGGESTIONS AND PROGRAMS THAT COME FROM PEOPLE ON THE OUTSIDE

WHO ARE BUSILY ENGAGED IN FINDING WHAT'S WRONG."

THESE PEOPLE DO NOT RPT NOT HAVE THE BENEFIT OF THE INFORMATION THAT COMES TO HIM FROM 110 COUNTRIES WHERE AMERICAN DIPLOMATS ARE STATIONED AND FROM THE MILITARY MEN IN SOUTH VIETNAM AND OTHER CIVILIAN AND MILITARY ADVISORS, THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE STATED. ITEM.
