Batton, Frank H., Memory of Dec 4-5, 1966

“Sweep of the area around the runway.

Burrows, Sam, Memory of Dec 4-5, 1966

Charles...I was asleep when attack broke out. Rushed to armory for weapons, loaded into back of open-body truck, delivered to flight line. Took part in sweep next day.

Carson, Ron (aka: RcElk), Memory of Dec 4-5, 1966

A1C Ron Carson, B Flight LE. Off duty asleep. We were housed in the barracks directly beside the Orderly Room. Across the street from the armory. Heard the mortar rounds coming in. Myself, Robert Spainhour and John Justice shared the same cubicle. Janice was just a couple cubicles down from us. We responded to the armory. Drew weapons and ammo. I exited the armory and boarded a bus filling up with off duty Security Troops. I don't know if my cubicle mates got on the bus or responded to the Law Enforcement building. We rode the bus down to Central Security Control and deployed flat on the ground until the mortar barrage lifted. Then moved up to reinforce the MLR. Sporadic gunfire continuing and I think a few more mortars. Later I was deployed with two other A2Cs to the south east perimeter to secure that area and be a blocking force also if needed. Stayed on duty until sunrise then back to the armory to report for dayshift duty. That following evening, Spain hour, Justice and I were sitting in our cubicle talking about the initial attack when suddenly we heard M16 firing. Quickly dressing we responded to the armory. And that is the last thing I remember that night. I have no idea Of anything that happened once I got to the armory. I have

ask Spainhour if he recalled where I was deployed that night. Unfortunately he doesn't recall. We later learned that the M16 we heard firing, was Sentry Dog Handler, Robert A. Throneburg, and his K-9, NEMO A534, engaging the enemy who were trying to get off the base.

Coxon, Pete, Memory of 4-5 Dec, 1966

“Sgt Pete Coxon, 377th Air Police Squadron, on the eve of the attack, I was assigned to Charlie-2 Security Alert Team (SAT).” When guard mount was done, a couple of guys who were off that night came up to me and asked what the intelligence report was that night. I told them the same old thing we were going to be hit by some elite VC Battalion. Upon inquiring why they asked, I was told that they had just came back from down town and the bar girls were telling folks that if you are from Tan Son Nhut, the VC are going to attack tonight. I took this serious and went into my barracks, to get my US Army flack vest, that I had scrounged a few months earlier. While in Charlies Sector and going from post to post giving coffee and conversing with troops on post. They all seemed to be amused at my story of the bar girls downtown saying we were going to be attacked that night. They also kidded me on wearing my flack vest. Around midnight, I conceded to their amusement and took off the vest and placed it on the hood of jeep. Around 0110 hours, I heard on the security police radio, a K9 post call in and informed Central Security Control (CSC), that there was a large group of people crossing the active runway, blocking runway lights at times. Then another K9 post called in and said they are all around me. At this time I remember mortar rounds started coming in. I grabbed my flack vest from the vehicle hood and put it on, and thought to myself, my initial hunch about the bar girls, was correct.

Rankhorn, Roger Memory of 4-5 Dec, 1966

“Blocking force to the perimeter road. RPG hit to my truck as I dismounted. Took part in 3 Search and Destroy Sweeps, one KIA in Utah Ditch.
